### BETWEEN THE TIMES March 24, 2012

The Family of God prepares to celebrate Holy Week and Easter. This is the most important week in the Christian Year. This is the time when we focus on what our faith is all about. And, because it is so important for us, we have to be careful to see everything that happens during the week. Rushing from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday is dangerous because doing that risks losing the meaning of the Resurrection of Jesus for us. Most important of all, we must pause for worship and reflection on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

Maundy Thursday remembers the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Communion. It also remembers the events of that night before and after the supper. We remember the disappointing behavior of the disciples as they squabbled amongst themselves over which of them was most important. We watch in shock as Jesus interrupts their fuss to show them what true importance means by washing their feet. We can scarcely believe our eyes and ears as the drama unfolds around the table. Judas has already made his agreement with the authorities to betray Jesus, and the Lord makes one last attempt to love the betrayer back into the fold. But, Judas will have none of it; and, having accepted Christ's gift of his body and blood, he goes off into the night to carry out his plan. We follow Jesus and the eleven out to Gethsemane to keep the vigil with them. Jesus prays in agony in the garden while the disciples sleep. Finally the authorities come to arrest Jesus, and another skirmish occurs. This time, Peter cuts off the ear of the High Priest's servant. Again, Jesus tries to show the disciples that violence is not his way. And, we watch as the scene shifts to the High Priest's house, where the mock trial takes place, and where Peter denies his Lord three times.

On Friday, we watch the scene where Jesus is questioned by the governor. Pilate is the man caught in the middle of many forces pulling against him. He understands Jesus is innocent, but is afraid of the Jews and the Emperor. He orders Jesus beaten half to death. The Roman soldiers mock him with the crown of thorns and the imitation purple robe of royalty. They have no idea that they are horribly mistreating Royalty beyond their every concept of the term. Then we see how the Jews gathered outside Pilate's palace and refused his offer to release Jesus. Then we hear the awful clamoring of the mob: Give us Barabbas! And, about Jesus: We have no king but Caesar! Crucify him!

Finally, the Lord of All is crucified at the hands of the people he loved. He loved even the Romans, because they were part of the humanity he came to save. As he breathed his last, one of the pagan soldiers got the point: Surely this man was the Son of God. And, the veil of the Temple was torn from top to bottom – an early sign that this drama was far from over and that a new beginning in the relationship between God and humanity was about to be revealed – but not yet.

First, there is the agony of Holy Saturday. Because it was the Sabbath, the body of the Lord had been hastily buried before sundown the night before. Those who were closest to Jesus could do nothing but sit around in shock and amazement all day long – wondering what in the world could have happened. It is a temptation for us to go about our usual business on Holy Saturday, but we must be careful. If we can't grasp the desperate feeling of those first disciples, we're in danger of missing the point.

The Sabbath ended at sundown on Saturday. But then, it was dark, and the disciples had to bed down for the night, though sleep was likely an impossibility. When it was just about daybreak, Mary Magdalene couldn't stand it any longer, and she made her way to the grave. Soon, we will see what she discovered.



We have several grocery sack full of items.






The staff of Trinity Presbyterian would like to "thank" Rev. Starr. for guiding us this past year and half. We wish him the best on his retirement.
