
# MERRY CHRISTMAS FROM REV. STARR AND THE STAFF AT TRINITY



### BETWEEN THE TIMES 11/29/2011

It's New Year time in the Liturgical Calendar. Most of us don't think about celebrating the new year until the 1<sup>st</sup> of January. But, the Church begins its new year with the Season of Advent – the first of the great Seasons of Preparation in the Liturgical Year. This is the time when we prepare ourselves to celebrate the birth of the Savior, and it is a time of very great importance for Christian people.

Christmas is almost a dangerous time for us. It's a time when we get all wound up in the business of decorating, having parties, school vacations, family gatherings, holiday feasts, and shopping like crazy for gifts to exchange. That's all very dangerous business. The danger lies in the hyperactivity which tends to make us forget why we're doing it all in the first place.

One might expect that some of the frenzy would slow down this year because of anxiety over the economic crisis. But, already the news has carried the story that this year's Black Friday was the best sales day since records for the day have been kept. Cyber Monday was also a huge success for merchants. One has to wonder where the money comes from. It is the nature of people that we always seem to find the money for the things we really want. But, there's something wrong with the picture – especially during Advent.

If we study the Scriptural account of the birth of Christ, it's very difficult to find a way to justify all our holiday madness. God's Greatest Gift to humanity did not take place in the middle of a large celebration with all the lights and greenery and various holiday productions. It was actually quite the opposite of all that.

If there's any similarity at all between our Christmas celebrations and the events surrounding the birth of Christ, it would have to be that a lot of busyness prevented most of the world from figuring out what had happened. There were the crowds in Bethlehem, but they hadn't come to participate in anything like the celebration of the birth of the Messiah. They were grudgingly there to sign up for the hated Roman taxation. If there were any thought about God at all, it was likely an angry sort of impatience with the Creator of All for allowing his people to live under this pagan oppression. The vast majority of the folks gathered there had no idea that God was right then giving them the gift of salvation – not only from Rome – but from the oppression the world had brought upon itself because of its own sinful behavior.

The Church has always sought to be careful to prepare for the celebration of the birth of Christ. If we're really to understand what it means for us, we have to be ready to receive it. There will, as always, be a flurry of activity in our lives during the coming weeks. But, our celebration could be so much more meaningful to us, if we could be intentional about taking time to turn our thoughts and our prayers to God, eagerly anticipating – not just the festivities of the holiday season – but the birth of that Special Child who came into our world to live among us so that we might come to know joy and happiness beyond anything we could possibly imagine or celebrate without him.

Grace, peace, and joy to all of you during the Season of Advent, 2011.

The committee has approved its proposed budget for Worship and Music for the year 2012. Ninety-six were served Holy Communion on Sunday, October 2, 2011. The communion serving set has been moved to its new storage location in the kitchenette, adjacent to the parlor.

After hearing concerns about attendance levels at Sunday services, a comparison was done for previous attendance levels. Average attendance:

2011 q4: 101 (first 3 weeks)


### Salvation Army Kettle Ringing
