To think of "mission," Christian mission, synonyms include *calling*, *lifework*, and vocation. Christian calling, lifework, has often been Scripturally summed up with two passages from Matthew, the first from Matthew 25 having to do with "the kingdom of heaven will be like":

"... 'And when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty ... And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing?' ... And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family you did it to me."
