Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Church,

A wonderful aspect of the Christian journey is that God calls us to accept new opportunities. With 2014 around the corner, your stewardship team looks forward to the challenges ahead.

We start by thanking you for your work as Christ's disciples. Through our church God in Christ has blessed our lives in many ways. We have responded to that blessing. With God's help we have provided a wonderful music and worship program. We have offered a variety of Christian Education opportunities. We have offered a beautiful well maintained church building. We have provided a dedicated staff. We have contributed to local and world mission. Throughout all this Christ has strengthened us, empowered us, saved us, made better our community and made better our worlds. And none of it would have been possible without your strong and sometimes sacrificial support. We give thanks for <u>all</u> the ways you've given and served.

As pastor Allison indicated in his newsletter, over the past several years our financial position has seriously declined. In part that is somewhat normal for churches without a pastor. We now have a full time pastor committed to serve us, stay with us and work with us in our Cause for Christ, and we have to let you know the seriousness of our financial need.

In 2011 and 2012 we withdrew from savings \$90,396 and \$61,064 respectively, and through November 2013 we have withdrawn \$65,755 to pay our bills. Our current savings balance is \$144,770. As you can readily see we cannot continue at this rate.

We have been blessed by faithful contributors. Some are now members of the Church Triumphant. All have provided resources to keep us solvent. Thanks be to them and to you, and thanks be to God!

Our *averaged* annual spending per year from 2002 through 2012 was \$265,642. Our proposed budget for 2014 is \$269,000. Over the years the leadership has sought to keep spending from increasing without diminishing program quality and content. The leadership has done well!

Our goal has been, and still is, to be faithful stewards of your tithes, offerings and sacrificial giving. We seek to provide the ministry and mission *you* seek. Our ministry is a strong and vital one.

What we can do now depends on you. Why do we love? Because we have "first been loved." Why do we give? Because we have been given much. "To whom much is given, much is expected." How much can we now do for God in Christ through the Trinity United Presbyterian Church.

After all of these have been received and prayerfully considered, giving thanks for God in Christ and for you as Christ's faithful servants we will make any necessary changes. We will dedicate our pledges and offerings and budgetary plans at a worship service in the near future.

Again, we are thankful for the generous support of the Trinity United Presbyterian Church. God has blessed us in ways far greater than we imagined. We now have before us opportunity and challenge. All around us is a world of great need physically, emotionally, and spiritually. We have a vision of meeting needs in sometimes unique and powerful ways.
