

From the Interim Pastor:

The Muskingum Valley Presbytery General Presbyter telephoned asking me to think about serving a pastoral interim for the Trinity United Presbyterian Church. She felt that my experience and ability was a match. I felt honored to be considered such.

The subsequent meeting with the church session's Interim Pastor Nominating Committee was once again a unique learning time. I have always come away from interview sessions with, I think, a deeper sense of what it means to be the Church in the Power of the Spirit.

They said they weren't going to, but I invited Nancy, Floyd, Frank, and Herb Perry, to grill me. They didn't really, but they asked the questions needed for due diligence in carrying out their task. From our candid back and forth I believe I came to know Zanesville's Trinity a little bit, wanting to know more.

It will be great to be with you. Tell me how I might best serve you. And these aren't just expected introductory words, gestures to custom. I really need you not to hesitate telling me what you think I should be doing. Yes, critiquing! And likewise I won't hesitate to tell you what I think you should be doing, or more exactly, what we should be doing. For it's out of these kinds of communicative tensions, dialectics, constructive criticism -- only out of these - that any church can be the church in the Power of the Spirit.

Because we are finite of mind, we only know in part now, as the Apostle put it with fine insight. So critique is vital, none of us having the whole thing sewn up. And it's no small part each of us have to play as the Church. When it comes to God and knowing God, I'm Christ-centric through and through. And of all of history's witnesses to Jesus as the Christ, I'm convinced that the Church long ago was right to say that the Gospels Matthew, Mark, Luke and John carry the words that mediate that Word, God in Christ, and the Power, and the Glory. It was God in Christ who said that against my Church the powers of death will not prevail, meaning that the church might live regardless, Powerfully, Spiritually.

The Church has said sometimes that one period of unsettlement is when the pastorate is vacant, that this is not good. And while the pastor has importance, he or she is no more important than any other, and not all such change of guard shakings of the foundation are bad.

A minister of yesterday said once that Christians see the Church as an *object* of *their* love rather than the *subject* and *instrument* of *God's*. That's why, he said, they don't like their particular church rocking like a boat. As he put it, they prefer to lie at anchor rather than go places in stormy seas.

But, he said, faith can't be at anchor. Faith can't be passive. Faith has to go forth. Faith has to assault the conscience. Faith has to excite the imagination. "Faith fans the flames of

creativity altogether as much as it banks the fires of sin." And the "tarnished but still glittering wonder of God's creation is worth fighting for." If you'd have Faith. And the Power of it.

Which made me think ... the living water that Jesus talked of, the water he said he could offer her from which she might drink and never be thirsty again, in the original language that water states the difference between death stagnation or life movement. It is even turbulent movement like that which rocks boats. Changing the image, from Acts 2 it is that which lays "divided tongues, like fire" of comprehending hope on the newly born. And changing the image again, it is that "Advocate, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatever I have said Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you, not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." Living Water. The Church in the Power of the Spirit.

But, let's offer some constructive criticism here. Sometimes recklessly, irresponsibly, Christians go into wind and rain unplanned, unprepared, so doing getting nowhere, doing nothing, saving no one. Or, on the other hand, venturing out to take on a tarnished yet glittering world, doing so not in a careless way, but prudently, "with all the mind" going forth conscience assaulting, imagination driving, Faith creating, Faith overcoming, and Living Water.

Looking forward to hearing how I might best serve you, to do my part along with you doing your part, each one important as the other, being by Grace a church within the Church.

Again, great to be with you. Hope to meet you soon.

Motion that there will be no communion service during the month of May. Approved. Motion that Sunday June 30, 2013 be a hymn-sing service. Approved

Attendance for Palm Sunday was 104. Maundy Thursday attendance was 44 and communion served to 41. The Good Friday Country Choir service had attendance of 239 and an offering of \$507.82 went to Operation Feed. The Easter Sunday total for two services was 155.

The last Sunday for the Chancel Choir will be May 19, Music Sunday. We will have special music during the summer months.

The speaker for the April 28, 2013 Gideon service will be Jarad Heagen. A Gideon offering will follow the message.



Reaching our goals Part 2



Take home Bible Study for June — Sabbath: An Acquired Taste

Exercise: Breaking the Logic of Task Pursuit

We need the Sabbath even though we doubt we have time for it. Dorothy Bass, Keeping Sabbath

The logic of task pursuit is best illustrated by a parable. A hermit, who lived far out in the forest, would cut enough wood each summer to heat his cabin through the winter. One fall day, he heard on his shortwave radio that an early winter storm was coming. Because he had not yet cut enough wood, he rushed to his wood pile.

Examining his dull and rusty saw, he realized that it needed sharpening. But as he paused, he looked at the pile of uncut wood and instead of sharpening his saw, he began to cut. As he worked the saw became more dull and his work harder and harder. He told himself that he needed to stop, but he continued to
