

Pastor Nominating Committee

The Pastor Nominating Committee held their first meeting on May 29, 2010. In late June we met with representatives from Presbytery to learn about the process we were about to begin. The next several months were spent on the self study process, including developing questions for a survey of the congregation. Once complete, the survey results were tabulated and much of that information was used to shape our Church Information Form.

The Church Information Form is often how candidates learn that Trinity is looking for a new pastor. They can see the form online and read about our church. Your Pastor Nominating Committee worked through the early part of 2011 preparing our Church Information Form. After several revisions, our CIF was approved by the Area 3 COM in May and our Church Information Form finally went online on May 29, 2011.

Once online, a matching process was initiated which immediately provided over 120 Pastor Information Forms (PIFs). Understand that this process is based to some extent on geographic location, job position, and so on. It is up to the committee to determine from that list which of the candidates might actually be a good match to the position at Trinity – the computer won't do that for us!

As of now, we have received over 200 PIFs. A PIF can average from 5-8 pages in length and some are 10 – 12 pages or more in length. So it is easy to see that we had a lot of information to process.

In the last few months of 2011 we requested and listened to a number of sample sermons from promising candidates. Based on sermons and the PIFs we further refined the list to a much smaller number of candidates that we wanted to interview. We conducted our first phone interview in November and several more in the beginning of 2012.

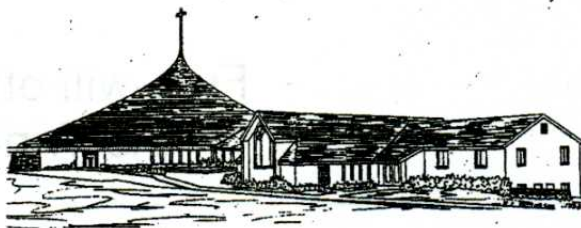
When I was asked to write an overview of the PNC process for the June newsletter, I realized that many do not understand the effort and dedication your committee has put forth on your behalf. It is not uncommon for the committee to meet 2 -3 times per month, with each meeting lasting an hour and a half to 2 hours to discuss PIFs that we have reviewed during the week, or watch or listen to sample sermons.

This has been a long process and I realize it may often seem mysterious to those not on the committee. But please keep in mind that our task is not simply to fill an open position on the Trinity staff. We are prayerfully working to find the right person to work with and lead Trinity in a way that is faithful to God's word.

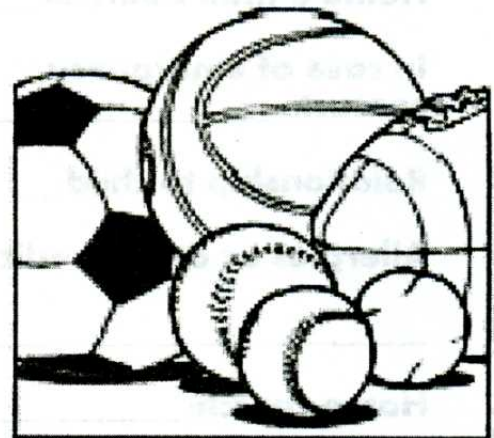
The Youth group of the church is inviting everyone to join them on July 1st following the service at 11:30 a.m., at the shelter house.

CAN YOU BE A GARDEN ANGEL?

The Building and Grounds Committee (B&G) needs your help. As the members of B&G age and face physical challenges we are having increased difficulty keeping the grounds of Trinity looking nice. We would like to propose a program where the congregation can help by adopting a garden or garden job to be completed on your own time. We are not creating any new gardens or expanding any gardens, just trying to maintain what we have.

The garden jobs will be divided into smaller units so any one person or family does not have a large commitment. Depending on which job you select, we can give you a good idea how much time and energy you will need to devote to being a Garden Angel. For example, Frank Walburg has been using a blower to remove leaves from the riprap near the office entrance, collect them on a tarp, and haul them to the woods. This should be done once a year: estimated work time is one to two hours. Thanks Frank! If you would adopt a flower garden your time commitment might be more and include mulching once a year, some trimming, and weeding.

We are asking for a one year commitment (sign up this year because 75% of the work is already done). Next spring we will offer the opportunity for those who enjoyed themselves to sign up again. You can work on your own time and with your own garden tools. We can offer amateur advice and help if you need it. B&G will purchase mulch and annuals for the gardens so you incur little or no expense. Your contribution is your time and energy.

If your heart wants to help but your body says "no," we occasionally need a patron or two when we need to replace some plants or buy mulch. This is our attempt to keep our grounds looking good without hiring a gardener. We welcome your suggestions and comments. Can you adopt a garden?

You are invited to join the Women's Bible study class. It meets at 11:00 a.m. in the parlor on every Thursday.

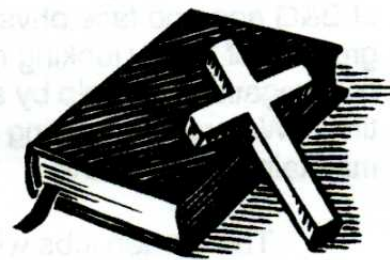
This summer the group is continuing to read *Spotlight of Faith* by Bill Crowder.

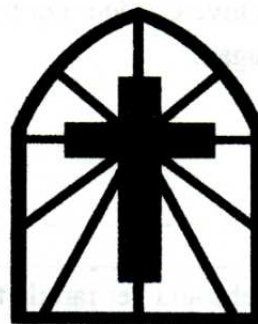
