During his recent presentation on The Apostles Creed, Dr. Shoemacher told of one of the famous wisdom sayings of the late Rev. John E. Burkhart, past professor of theology at McCormick Theological Seminary, with whom we both studied at various times. "Never dig a hole so deep that you can't see out the top!" With Dr. Burkhart's wisdom fresh in mind, I ran across a blog by a writer named Jeff Sexton from somewhere or another on the topic, Lenten Thoughts on Ash Wednesday. His subtopic is, What tells you when it's time to stop digging? Further, he writes:

That repentance is necessary for salvation is hardly a principle confined to Christianity. It's really as simple as saying that if you've dug yourself into a hole, you need to:

- 1. realize you're in a hole, and
- 2. stop digging, and
- 3. become open to solutions (aka, a way out)

And until you do, you won't have much hope of getting out of that hole. Obviously, the sooner you recognize the hole, the easier the process is.

That's a good introduction to the Season of Lent – one with which John the Baptizer would certainly agree. The Lenten message of John proclaims loudly to all: Look! Look what you're doing! You're digging a hole for yourselves! It's getting very deep! Already, you can't see out the top! Stop digging, and start looking for solutions! Actually, John doesn't offer a cafeteria of choices for solutions. He offers only one: Bear fruit worthy of repentance or risk being cut down and thrown into the fire. John was not terribly subtle. He didn't believe he could afford to be. For him, the message was urgent because he was afraid the hole people were digging would finish up being their grave. He knew the solution was even then coming down the road: A man named Jesus, whose shoes John felt himself unworthy to carry. That man, Jesus, was the Savior of the World – the only person who could save the world from that grave the people were furiously digging for themselves.

John speaks just as urgently to us. All these centuries after he first introduced the world to Jesus, people have again become complacent. Even Christians — even good Zanesville Presbyterian Christians — have become complacent. We have come to believe that our long heritage as Christian people secures for us all the favor of God we could ever possibly need. We're amazingly like those first century Jews who believed they had inherited the faith of Abraham — a faith so strong that it made them as safe from God's wrath as they could ever possibly be. But, John came a long and said, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. To us, he might say, Your good Presbyterian upbringing — plus \$2.25 — might buy you a cup of coffee, but not salvation! We're in that same hole that we've dug for ourselves — urgently in need of the salvation that only Jesus can bring, but not realizing that we need it. If we don't know we need it, we can't appreciate God's gift of it. That's another way of saying that we cannot ever be able to celebrate Easter, if we have no understanding that it is for us.

That's what Lent is all about. Lent is about helping us realize that it's time to stop digging. We've already dug too deeply to see out the top of our hole. It's already for us a grave that is just waiting to cave in on us. We need to stop digging. But, even at that, we can't climb out by ourselves. It's too deep, and we have no ladders or lifts that can reach down to us. There is only that man Jesus. We've got a bit less than 40 days now to get to know him and to realize how much he can do for us. If we make that discovery, then Easter can be real for us!







A Little about One Great Hour of Sharing

Immediately following World War II, Protestant churches in the U.S. made appeals for the relief and reconstruction of areas devastated by the was, primarily in Europe and Asia. In 1949, the leaders of several denominations formed a committee to organize an appeal to support their churches' separate campaigns.

A program called One Great Hour was broadcast on March 26, 1949, over major networks and many independent stations. The broadcast closed with a request that listeners attend their local church the following morning and make a sacrificial contribution. No exact measure of receipts was possible, but it was estimated that more than 75,000 churches participated.

The next year, the offering was repeated, using the name "One

Great Hour of Sharing" for the first time. At times, One Great Hour of Sharing was coordinated with both the Roman Catholic Bishops' Fund Appeal for Oversees Aid and the Jewish Passover Appeal. Free time and space were donated to this joint appeal through the Advertising Council.

From the beginning, this has been an ecumenical effort. As denominations changed and merged, One Great Hour of Sharing has varied from 8 to 29 participating communions. While each denomination allocates its gifts differently, all use their funds for ministries of disaster relief, refugee assistance and development aid. Today, projects supported by One Great Hour of Sharing are under way in more than 100 countries, including the United States and


Canada. In recent years Presbyterians have given about \$10 million annually.

Q: Do gifts from Presbyterians stay within the denomination?

A: Yes. Gifts given by Presbyterians will be used within the PC(USA).

Q: How does the PC(USA) use its offering gifts?

A: They are divided among three programs. Self-Development of People and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance each receive 32% of the offering and the Presbyterian Hunger Program receiving 36%.

feed the CASS-MIND kids, grab a tag off the board in the Narthex and bring the item on the following Sunday.


