Dear Trinity United Presbyterian Church,

As it is the first newsletter of the year, I want to wish you all a happy new year! On February 7th, we celebrated our first-year anniversary of moving to Peru, so we are definitely lifting up the past year of learning and growth and looking forward to a new year of possibilities that God will lay before us personally and in our ministry here.

We ended the year by celebrating Christmas in Bolivia with Jose's family. Given the political unrest that had been occurring there since late October, due to corrupt presidential elections, we were grateful we were able to safely travel and be with them. It was a joyful time to be with family, especially for Leandro, as he learned to adjust to altitude, turned two on January 4th, got his first haircut, and experienced real downpours of rain! (Rain is scarce to nonexistent in the desert of Lima.)

Upon our return to the hot summer time here in Lima, we returned to work. We attended the General Assembly of our partners, the Evangelical Church of Peru (IEP), in the city of Huánaco in central Peru. It was an interesting time to meet, talk, and plan with some of our partners; be introduced to more leaders of the church; as well as learn about how the denomination functions with all of its joys and challenges. A new president was elected after we departed, so we will be meeting with him next week to officially introduce ourselves and renew our covenant with the IEP.

Pastor's Ponderings

Dear Church,

Lent. The word itself sounds almost gentle, like a soft woolen blanket that wraps around you on a raw March night, keeping you safe, dry and warm. Or perhaps like a good deed you might do for a friend: "I lent the neighbors cream and sugar so they could have their morning coffee."

And yet the season of Lent is not thought of as so cozy.

After all, it *is* March. The weather is dreary, raw and (probably) quite rainy. As much as we'd like to get outside for a neighborhood walk, or to prepare the garden for the growing season ahead... it's just too muddy, too damp, too grey. It simply isn't quite yet time.

Better go back inside for a hot cuppa', a good book and a nap.

What's more, remembering Jesus' journey towards the cross is something of a challenging faith journey.

- How could he have chosen to give up his life to let the hungry and poor know someone cared (and *cared* and **cared!**) for them so much that he'd bet his life on their value?
- Does he care for me as he did for them?
- How can I let him know how grateful I am for his life?

These thoughts are a bit worrisome, and like getting the taxes done, we'd often rather deal with them later.

But Lent is as inevitable as was the cross. You can't have one without the other.

And quite honestly, I am glad for that. You see, I believe we need to set aside time each year to reflect on what it is about this man Jesus that we have decided to commit ourselves to living as he did. We need to reconsider if his way of life is the way we have lived our lives, and if it's the way they should be lived in the future.

Five of the young people who've been raised in this congregation are actively processing these questions right now.

Since last fall these young adults with incredible, curious minds and great big hearts have been working with Kris Beebe and Jennifer Ardrey to figure out if they really do believe that Jesus is their Lord and Savior.

They've been learning what it means to be a Disciple of Jesus and show his compassion to the people and world they touch.

And they are looking at how they will answer four big questions that face Presbyterian Christians everywhere: Will you devote yourself

- to the Church's teachings?
- to the Church's fellowship?
- to the breaking of bread?
- to prayer?

Those questions may look easy. But we all know that truly living life as a follower of Jesus' way is actually quite hard!

It's with that in mind I invite you to take time over the six weeks of Lent to take a closer look at your own faith life and ask yourself the same questions they are asking of themselves.

- Am I following Jesus' teaching of loving God and loving others as I love myself? Do I read God's holy word regularly? Have I thought about how I am living out the meaning of the words of our Presbyterian confessions of faith? Have I really tried to walk the talk lately?
- Am I investing in relationships with my church family? Am I spending time with other members to simply talk (without an agenda!) or enjoy life together in a more active way?
- Do I do my best to worship regularly – especially on days when the Lord's Supper is offered – even if this means putting off (not totally cancelling) a leisure activity that I might enjoy? (OMG!!!)
- Do I take time to talk with God in a meaningful way each day? Do I listen quietly during those times for the Spirit's presence? Do I watch for God's activity in my daily comings and goings? Do I respond to those nudges I feel that must be “a God thing”?
- AND ONE MORE THOUGHT: Do I remember to regularly show my appreciation for the life God has given me by living as Christ taught his first Disciples?

People often hear that we have to give things up during Lent in order to experience the pain Jesus felt as he gave up his life for those he loved. This is one valid way of looking at this faith journey. But I would also argue that Jesus felt not only physical pain, but spiritual joy and thanksgiving as he went through his earthly life – even unto death on the cross.

I say that in the firm belief that because we are called to share our lives with him and in service to him, Lent is a wonderful time to invest in our relationship with him and our faith in him. Lent is a special time when we can make room in our lives to focus attention on wrestling with the faith questions outlined above.

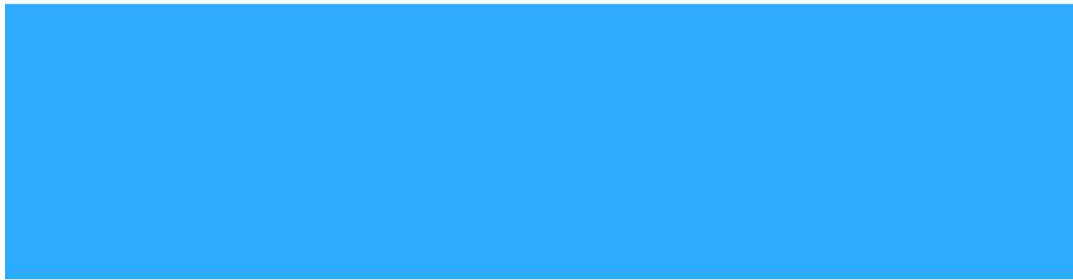
Most of all, Lent is a time to step away from our everyday lives to thank God for all the gifts of our lives (especially that Jesus cared and cared enough for us to die for us!) by also offering ourselves in service to others who may need support of some kind – spiritual, emotional, physical or even financial.

Yes, March is chilly and dreary, which makes Lent feel much the same. But through reflection, prayer and service in Jesus' name the time can become cozy and warm, too. Thanks be to God for the gift of this holy season!

Emergency Response Committee

Safety Update from the Emergency Response Committee:

Many of you have already received an email from Pastor Deb regarding new safety and security measures at Trinity. We are including this news in the *Trinity Triumph* for those without computer access.

Over the last several years conversations have bubbled up regarding the security of the church facility. We recognize there are far too many tragedies happening in places where people gather – including church buildings. Still, we are Christ’s body on earth and we want to welcome those who knock on our doors... Yet we all want to feel safe in our surroundings. How do we respond in this situation?

Recently many congregation members met with a detective from the Zanesville Police Department to learn how we can proactively protect one another while here. During that meeting, we were made aware of additional security concerns at Trinity that warrant everyone’s attention.

So that we can move forward to address all these concerns, a special session meeting was called, and the Emergency Response Committee made a motion that all doors to the church - except for the main entrance, be locked on Sundays. The motion was approved by session.

This new security measure became effective immediately, beginning with the worship service of February 16, 2020.

The main entrance doors will be unlocked at 9:00 a.m. Sunday mornings, and they will be locked after the Scripture is presented in the chancel near the beginning of the service. An usher will be present in the narthex during the service to admit anyone arriving after the main entrance has been locked.

Please know that this decision was not made lightly, and there was much discussion on this safety issue. Many other churches have already adopted this practice for Sunday services.

We realize that this may impact parking choices for some, but hopefully this will not be a hardship, as we aspire to be proactive in the safety for everyone.

As an additional reminder, please remember to always lock car doors when on the church property, be aware of your surroundings and let your group’s leader know if something seems “off” to you. If you see something, say something. Also, always check doors when leaving the church to be sure they are locked behind you.

Thank you to all for your understanding and cooperation in this new security effort.

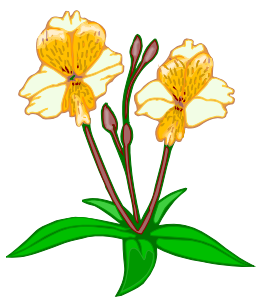

Confirmation Class Trip

On February 1st members of the confirmation class and chaperones journeyed to Columbus to Congregation Tifereth Israel, a conservative synagogue. Under the watchful eye of the security guard we were warmly welcomed by member and greeter Jane. She introduced us to several other key people and the rabbi even came out of the service to greet us! We wore the "caps" or yarmulkes as requested and entered their massive worship room. (Men are required to wear the yarmulkes, and for women wearing them is optional. However, many women wore them.) The service was mostly in Hebrew, but they had books with the order printed in Hebrew on the right side and in English on the left. As Hebrew is written from the right to the left, their books open from what we consider to be the back. Most of the worshipers knew the words by heart and participated easily. Both women and men took part in the service. At the back it appeared that two pews had been removed, and an area had been created for young children to crawl and play quietly as their parents participated. At the conclusion of the service Jane appeared again and invited and encouraged us to join them for lunch. It was a Kashrut meal, meaning they do not allow meat and dairy in the same meal. This meal was all dairy. We enjoyed the meal and the fellowship. We happened to sit at the table with the rabbi emeritus and his family, and the conversation was very interesting. Thanks to Rev. Deb for encouraging us to make the visit and arranging the details for us.

The confirmation youth are busily planning the service for March 15th. We hope you will join us for the service this day. The youth are in the process of planning and practicing their individual responsibilities. As of now, the ushers and the group assigned to snacks after church will remain as already scheduled.
