Waiting for Pentecost (Acts 1 and 2)

The disciples felt alone. Again they entered a period when their teacher and companion of the three previous years was not with them. Easter Sunday had passed. For a short while they had spent time with the risen Lord. Watching him ascend they were given another strange instruction to "stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." What in the world did this mean? How would this help the loss of their friend they were surely feeling? Jesus had presented them with many new concepts and experiences never encountered in history. They were about to meet another. At this point Luke ends his gospel and starts Acts with Jesus saying "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you".

The disciples spent their time in the temple blessing God. The apostles were together in the room upstairs where they were staying. The eleven were devoting themselves to prayer along with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers. Acts records as their one piece of business replacing the traitor Judas Iscariot with Matthias.

Then the day of Pentecost arrived fifty days after Easter. Acts presents the arrival of the Holy Spirit among the disciples as "like the rush of a violent wind" and "Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them". They were filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke in other languages as the Spirit gave them the ability – to the point that they were accused of being drunk.

At this moment Peter address the crowd denying the accusation of drinking because it was 9:00am. Led by the Spirit received that day he made five points in his preaching: 1) "a man attested to you by God among you" 2) "you have crucified and killed" 3) "But God raised him up" and "This Jesus God raised up" 4) "God has made him both Lord and Messiah" 5) "you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit".

That day the Church increased by adding 3,000 converts to the original 120. The power of the Holy Spirit given to the body of Christ, the church, enabled the church to grow significantly by witnessing in Jerusalem, and later in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Throughout history God has always been with his people. In Old Testament times in a pillar of cloud during the day and in a pillar of fire at night, in the tabernacle and later the temple. Jesus the Messiah was named Emmanuel – "God with us". After his ascension He sent what the Father promised and the Holy Spirit arrived on that first Pentecost to dwell with God's people – Christ's Church. He is the Spirit of truth, teacher and reminder of everything Jesus has said to us.

The Holy Spirit came to be with us forever; a comforter, helper and advocate.

Trinity will take up the Pentecost Offering during the Worship Service on May 27th. The children will be using the red "church" banks during their preparations. Offering envelopes will be in the bulletin that Sunday also.

The Offering

At Pentecost, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit as a bringer of new life. With the Spirit's coming, we no longer need to settle for business as usual but can know the transforming, redeeming love of God that makes the impossible possible.

The Pentecost Offering is one of the special offerings of the Presbyterian Church (USA). When you give to the Pentecost Offering you help bring God's transforming and redeeming love to children at risk, guide and nurture young people's growing faith and provide opportunities for young adults to become spiritual leaders within the PC(USA).

Our theme this year is "So I send you," spoken by Jesus in John 20:21. Jesus reminds us that God sent him to heal a world in desperate need of a Savior. As followers of Jesus Christ, we are called by God to be the "sent-ones" and heal a hurting world in Jesus' name. Your gifts to the Pentecost Offering help make that calling a reality in the lives of children, youth and young adults.


