Rev. Dennís Allíson: Wieldíng Scrípture, Saws, & Salvatíon

Where were you born? Kansas City, Missouri.

What was your favorite subject in school? A past and present tense answer. I'm still in school, never finished, have too much to make up for (I am still trying to learn to read without moving my lips). I don't have a "favorite" subject. As a young child and teenager I did not enjoy "school" and was not what would be considered a good student. Later, much later, I didn't mind school as long it didn't interfere with my education. Today I take in free lectures, purchase lectures, all subjects, all are of great interest, especially areas about which I know little, which is every area.

What was the most trouble you got into in grade

school? A perfect little child of course. As a pre-(destined)Presbyterian minister who would one day be charged with setting example upon example for congregation upon congregation, I, therefore, never got into trouble. What kind of a question is this?

What was your first job? I worked in a filling station.

When and how were you called to the ministry? In my early twenties for whatever reason I decided to begin attending again a church I had dropped out of in my early teens. A fresh-from-ministerschool pastor was in the process of arriving and I liked him. So I thought, well, I'll keep coming around awhile for this guy. I began singing with the choir. I was sitting in the choir loft one Sunday and it hit me, and "hit me" is not particularly hyperbole, it hit me that if even 50% of what is being said about this Jesus of Scripture is true, this is the most profoundly vital idea for mankind, an idea beyond man's capacity to create, and I need to be out doing something about it. After that I had no peace in my life until I was out doing something



about it. Doing something about it became ministry.

What was your least favorite thing about "pastor school?" Don't-ask-questions-but-just-spit-it-back-at-me nonsense.

What are 3 hobbies you enjoy outside of the ministry? (or however many you have) I don't know that I have hobbies per se. I read, fix stuff and enjoy physical exercise.

If you could vacation anywhere in the world, where would you go? I don't enjoy going to other places.

If you could have dinner with 3 people from history, who would they be? Well, certainly Jesus as the Christ. I am fascinated with the Paul of Scripture's Romans, with his ability to live so comfortably within tremendous paradox while at the same time exercising great courage. And, Paul Tillich.

What is your vice? Ah, another "trouble in school" kind of question. Yes, well, I don't have a vice. Except in the shop. Come on, surely you don't think this Presbyterian Church (USA) pastor has a vice, do you?

Tell us about your family. What do you want to know? Wonderful family. Fine family. Patient with me, tolerant. Becky, Registered Nurse, stalwart supporter (sturdy, and keeps a good house) and number-one critic; daughter, Monica, Senior Systems Analyst for Memorial Sloane Kettering Cancer Center, New York City, also songwriter; daughter, Lauren, Goodwill Industries, Mansfield, Ohio, plays the violin and creates electronica music and has a dog furiously devoted to her.

What is the best thing about being the Pastor at Trinity UP Church? Fun, fun people. Interesting, diverse congregation. Energizing. People giving of themselves, going out of their way, devoting time, talent, personal resources to be this unique church for this particular place in this particular time. What a fine thing. What a privilege to seek to be of service in such a context.

TAKE ANOTHER LOOK! What, Really, IS Our Parish Council? Recently, there have been some real changes in the ways we Presbyterians work together. Happily, this change really looks good!

In the past, everything concerning the Zanesville Presbyterian churches was worked through our Presbytery (Muskingum Valley Presbytery), headquartered in New Philadelphia. Not often, but every once-and-awhile, this has felt like management "from the outside." BIG changes have happened in church government. For one thing, our most basic document, The Book of Order, has been completely reedited and (Are you ready for this?) made 2/3 SHORTER! This document has been around since 1789, and has been gaining in size ever since. By shortening this part of our church constitution, it becomes much more flexible and less cumbersome.

Here's more real good news! By creating a LOCAL church governing body, the PARISH COUNCIL, a huge part of church oversight is now done by encouraging representatives to work together to deal with local issues. This is really the first time in the history of Presbyterians that our presbyteries have, officially, made this possible!

Our Greater Zanesville Parish Council brings together all Presbyterian congregations in easy driving time from our city center. You really don't have to live in our town very long before learning that many of our problems and opportunities have grown up over time. What could be more welcome than the chance to gather representatives from each of our neighboring churches to work together as we serve Jesus in this time and place?



The range of local issues seems endless. Christ's Table and East Side Ministry have always been vital. The Fellowship of Christ's Community, meeting currently at Central Presbyterian Church, continues a unique ministry to our inner city area. As a wider parish, congregations can work together on Vacation Bible School. Just getting together for church dinners and social times can help to develop inter church possibilities for ministry. On the practical side, Parish Council is currently arranging for the required, annual review of session minutes. It's important, in all of this, to notice how both planning and follow-through of programs is done locally.

Here at Trinity, we've been ably represented by our pastor, Dennis Allison, Amanda Allison, Bill Miska, Frank Walburg, and Jim Schumacher. While our presbytery schedules only four meetings each year (frequently at distant points throughout the area) Parish Council can meet every month, avoiding travel time and expense.

It might come as a surprise that our name, as Presbyterians, doesn't so much describe what we believe as it describes how we're governed (representative democracy, exactly the same as our American civil government). Incidentally, "Presbyterian" comes from the New Testament Greek word that means, "elder." It is by no accident that Presbyterian congregations were strong supporters of our first American Continental Congress. That support was put to the test, particularly in the Battles of Trenton and Princeton (the crucial turning-point of our American Revolution). And now you know the rest of the story.

Youth News


Upcoming Youth Events:

Many items were donated by Trinity friends for the silent and Chinese auctions, and the bake sale. The event was a total success and all proceeds are being used to defray Alyssa's medical expenses.

Alyssa's family would like to thank all from our church family who participated in any way. An update on Alyssa's condition: She has been in remission since mid-January, and continues to receive a rotation of different chemotherapies. She is currently on steroids, which seem to affect her the most; but she is young and resilient, and seems to take most of her treatments in stride. Due to immunity issues, she is not able to be around many people and with help from family and friends, Chad and Kelly are able to keep her at home most of the time.
