November, 2011

November is coming soon, and November is the traditional time for thinking about Thanksgiving. The real truth of the matter is that giving thanks is entirely too central to our existence to reserve only a couple of days out of one month of the year to give it special attention. The Church is founded upon giving thanks. Its entire life is dependent upon giving thanks. Our whole existence depends on giving thanks.

The Christian Church began as an act of giving thanks to God because of the great gift of salvation through Jesus Christ. Much farther back in history than that, the Hebrew people gave thanks to God for calling them to be his servant people and for leading them successfully through centuries of good times and difficult times on their journey toward building a community of faith created and sustained by God.

Giving thanks is such a central theme in the Bible that dominates all our understanding of God's involvement with people. People were created for giving thanks. The Bible teaches that, when we come to understand who God is, and what God did – and does – for the people he created and called, the only possible response is to give God thanks and praise. And how do we do that?

In the very beginning of God's relationship with people, giving thanks meant offering sacrifices as individuals and as a community, and gathering as a community for worship. Early on in the Hebrew tradition, it was understood that giving thanks to God had to be seen in acts beyond sacrifice and worship. True thankfulness to God had to be demonstrated in how God's thankful people treat one another – and how they treat even the strangers among them. And, so it came to be that Israelite culture developed the important idea of taking care of one another.

Yes! They practiced distribution of wealth! It was the duty of people who lived in prosperity to provide for the needs of those who were poor. Widows and orphans were to be looked after by the community. Farmers were required to leave a certain amount of their crops unharvested so that the poor could gather it up in order to eat. Offerings were regularly received for the poor and the disabled. All that was done as an act of thanksgiving for God's graciousness to the entire community. And, when the community failed to take care of its weaker members, the Prophets loudly denounced them for turning their backs on the ways of the Lord.

Because God shared all these mighty acts with his people, and because he gave the ultimate gift of self-sacrifice by sending Jesus to die for our salvation, we have life – now and forever. In the most literal of senses, our whole existence depends upon our giving thanks to God for so many blessings. And, in the troubled world of 2011, where the needs of so many are so visible all around us, I think there could be no greater opportunity for us to thank God for our existence and hope for heaven than by sharing what we have with those in need.

Do you think you don't have enough? There are many who have nothing. Do you think you can't afford to share? Jesus asks how you can afford not to. Are you afraid being thankful in generous giving will break the bank for you? Then, you especially, need this time of Thanksgiving to learn about what God means we he says that we have all received freely, and are therefore called to give as feely as we have received.

On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>September 18, 2011</u>, at 11:40AM we met in the Chapel for devotions led by Elder Norma Littick. At the conclusion of the devotions and prayer, we moved to the High School classroom for the business portion of the meeting. Our Moderator Rev. Floyd Starr called us to order and service. A quorum was declared with 11 Elders present.

Clerk's Report: The agenda for September 18, 2011 was approved along with the minutes from the August 21, 2011 meeting. Various publications received have been placed in the library.

The business portion of the meeting began with a special presentation on Narcotics Anonymous by Traci and Ron Couch. The organization is requesting permission to use a classroom 4 evenings per week, year round, 6:30 – 8:15. They also request a 2 week notice for the termination of the agreement, should it be accepted. Following the presentation, a motion was made to take from the table the Traci's facility use request. Motion approved.

A motion was made to accept the Narcotics Anonymous facility use request with the 2 week termination agreement. The motion was seconded, discussed and approved. N.A. may begin meeting in early October.

Following the presentation, the clerk reported the following:

- A letter has been sent to Schantz Organ Company to discontinue service and maintenance for the organ, as directed by Session. Signed and sent the new contract to Peebles-Herzog.
- We received a letter of thanks from 'Forever Dads' for our gift of \$256.
- Thank you note from the Ardreys for the use of the church for their family reunion.
- Facility use requests:
 - Request use of the Fellowship Hall and Kitchen on Feb 4, 2012 beginning at 4PM for a Boy Scout Banquet by Dan and Kris Beebe.
 - Cindy Sheets requests use of the Youth Room on October 15, 2011, for a
 meeting beginning at 10AM. She also requests use of the Youth kitchen to bake
 cookies, 15 persons expected to attend.

A motion was made to accept the facility use requests, approved.

• Marriages: Jeffrey S. Gains and Cynthia J. Miller were wed at Trinity on Sept. 10, 2011.

Moderators Report: Rev. Starr noted that the Fall program Sunday School classes and Bible studies have begun. He is teaching the adult Sunday School class.

Deacon Report: Minutes received.

Presbytery: The Presbytery meeting took place the day on September 17. Rev. Starr reported that nFog is now in effect and that the new Book of Order is not yet printed.

Old Business: A motion was made to take from the table the remaining facility use requests from the August 21 session meeting. These requests were tabled due to scheduling conflicts, now resolved.

Trinity United Presbyterian Church Session Minutes for September 18th, 2011

- The Boy Scouts have renewed their request to meet on the 1st Thursday of each month from September – May from 7:00 – 8:30 in the Chapel (and then class rooms for group discussions) 20 – 30 persons expected.
- The Daisy Troop 1862 (we sponsor) is requesting the Fellowship Hall, number of persons not specified, to meet on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Thursdays of each month, Sept – June, from 6 – 7:30.

Motion made to approve both requests. Approved.

Worship and Music Report: 90 people received communion on September 4, 2011.

The committee presented a program to begin a fund drive to purchase a Grand Piano for the sanctuary. The motion to begin raising funds in order to purchase a Yamaha GC2 polished ebony grand piano for the sanctuary at a cost of \$20,000 was approved.

Elder Nancy Thompson suggested the possibility of using Patton monies to help fund the piano. Discussion followed but no action taken.

The sound system has been checked by C.A. House and it found the cause of the issue where none of the hearing aids were picking up the broadcast. The wiring for broadcast device will be corrected. We are looking at a component to add on to the sound system that will allow the use of split track CDs for performances, which will cost about \$100 plus labor and also looking at a new hand-held microphone, estimated at \$500 plus labor.

Outreach: The committee met last week. They are working on advertising for the Rich Simcox Band. There will be 30 second spots on WHIZ and ads in the Times Recorder. There will be some raffle items at the benefit. The concert will be held on September 25, 2011.

<u>Christian Education</u>: Amanda requests permission to work toward certification in Christian Ed. This will be done on her own time. Motion was made, discussed and approved.

The committee discussed the need for a Youth Director and they believe our children need this commitment from our church.

In order to have the Halloween party, one of the committees will have to sponsor it, looking for a committee to sponsor it.

The youth will be going to the Souper Bowl on October 16, 2011.

Personnel: No report

Nominating & Membership: No report

Finance: The monthly finance report was presented. The balance figure for September was negative.

The rental house, which no longer exists, has been removed from the financial report.

The committee is preparing for the Stewardship campaign.

The committee was asked to confirm whether or not per capita has been paid for 2011.

Report was accepted.

Building and Grounds: We need to fix the cords on the new window blinds for safety. The organ in the Fellowship Hall is not wanted by the family who donated it, so it will be disposed of. The piano in the youth room will go to Lori Meadows.

A motion was made to convert the doorway from the parlor kitchenette to the 'Cry room' into a small closet to store communion materials. Elder Richard Patterson will construct the closet. Motion approved.

Missions: The Kidzville cleanup project by church members was a success. A card of appreciation was received from Matt Phillips, Supervisor, City Parks and Cemeteries.

The 2011 Souper Bowl is Sunday, October 16, 2011. The youth will help with the serving from 11AM – 2PM.

New Business: There will be a Youth Room dedication on October 23rd. This will be a cookie-coffee event after the service, with the youth serving the congregation.

Time of Sharing Joys and Challenges: We thank God for all the blessings at Trinity.

The meeting was adjourned and closed with prayer at 1:30PM pm by Rev. Floyd Starr, Moderator.

Next scheduled Session meeting is October 16, 2011.

Pastor Nominating Committee Update

The PNC has been meeting regularly reviewing Pastor Information Forms and lately we have been listening to sermon CDs. Our Church Information Form went online in late May and since that time we have received 171 Pastor Information Forms. We spent the summer reviewing this list and have refined it to a much more manageable list of less than twenty candidates.

We have requested and listened to a number of sample sermons from candidates we felt most closely matched the criteria that we developed using our earlier survey of the congregation. Based on the sermons and the PIFs, we are further refining the list to a much smaller number of candidates we would like to interview.

At this point we have not interviewed any of the candidates, but we expect to be at that point soon. As always, we appreciate your prayers for our committee as we work to discern who should be the next Pastor at Trinity.

On September 18, 2011, the Worship and Music committee presented, and session approved, a proposal to purchase a grand piano for the sanctuary. This congregation has always supported and appreciated Trinity's music program. This appreciation is reflected in the high quality organ that was chosen by the newly merged congregation to be a part of the design of the new church, and in the high quality bells given later by a church family member.

Our current piano is really designed for a much smaller space. In addition, it has degraded to the point that it detracts from musical performances. Also, it is not conducive to use with the choir because of its design; the sound goes directly into the wall, making it difficult for the choir to hear from the loft. The proposed piano is designed to fill a larger space, as is commonly seen in church sanctuaries and auditoriums. The grand piano's rich sound will be an enhancement to the choirs and other musicians.

The Outreach committee is working to bring in musical guests and is in the beginning stages of hosting concerts at Trinity, such as the recent Rich Simcox Big Band concert. A quality piano will make our facility an attraction to outside musicians and music lovers alike. With this proposal we are looking at the bigger picture - the future growth of Trinity.

The proposed piano is a Yamaha GC2 in polished ebony, 5'-8" in length. CA House of Music has quoted a price of \$19,400 including the church discount. Additionally we will purchase a spider dolly which is priced between \$500 and \$600, bring the total to cost to \$20,000.

In order to pay for the piano, we are beginning a fundraising campaign entitled, "Purchase a Piece of the Piano". As with any large endeavor, it is best to break the task down into smaller components. That is what we have done here. In the narthex you will find a poster which has a list of the various components of a piano broken down by price. This is an opportunity for members to donate a component or components. Or members could go in together to purchase a larger component. For example, a piano key is \$25, the bench is \$300, or a leg is \$1,500. Donations should be clearly marked for "the Piano Fund". Donations can be put in the offering plates or given to Nancy in the office.

Our goal is to wrap up the campaign by the end of November, so that we can enjoy the rich sounds of our new grand piano as part of our Christmas Eve service.





In case you missed it: Journaling the S.O.A.P. method

Journaling is an excellent way to both record and process what God reveals during our time with Him. It is also useful to be able to review the nuggets of wisdom we've discovered. And, let's be honest, we all tend to forget God's blessings and the important lessons He teaches if we don't write them down.



S for scripture

Take time as you read to allow God to speak. Was there a verse that particularly spoke to you? Write the verse number or the verse verbatim or paraphrased in your journal.

O for observation

How does this verse fit in with the surrounding verses? Why was this said? What do you think caused this response? Does this cause you to think of other passages? Record your thoughts.

A for application

Personalize what you have read. How does it apply to your life right now? IS it instruction, encouragement, revelation of a new promise, or correction for a particular area of your life? Write how this passage applies to you today.

P for prayer

Ask God to help you understand what you have read and what He wants to reveal to you. Remember, prayer is a two way conversation, so be sure to listen to what He has to say. Record your prayer in your journal.


