PNC Update

October 2012

It is time for another update from the PNC. Your committee is working hard for you! We typically meet 2 or 3 times per month, with each meeting lasting approximately 1-1/2 – 2 hours. If we are interviewing, the meetings may run longer and we may meet more frequently. Between meetings we are reviewing Pastor Information Forms, researching pastors, listening to sermons, and...preparing for the next meeting.

To date we have received and reviewed over 200 PIFs since the first one arrived in June of 2011. The majority of these are matched to us via a computer system. We began conducting phone interviews in December of last year. At this point we have interviewed somewhere between 5 and 10% of those candidates.

Remember that the matching is based on fairly loose criteria. Appearance on the list is not necessarily an indication of a real 'match'.

You can help the committee. How? Pray! Pray for the committee, the candidates, and our congregation.

Be patient and trust God! I know the process is frustrating and slow, but there is hope!

In a time of distress the psalmist said, "Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise Him, my salvation and my God" (Psalm 43:5)

We have to trust in God, place our hope in God. I believe if we decide that God is taking too long, that He has forgotten our discomfort or not noticed our pain ... well the Bible is full of stories about people who only trusted God to a point. They received what God promised, but they also paid the consequences for their lack of faith.

Now is the time for us to show our faith! It is easy to be faithful at the beginning of a journey. Even if it is not the most pleasant of journeys there is a degree of excitement about what is to come. But that is faith untested. Once you are far into the journey and face obstacles –**that** is the time to hold onto your faith, to trust God.

Finally, you can help by continuing to be engaged at Trinity! Attend Sunday school, participate in a Bible study! If a friend has not been in church lately, invite them to come back! There is a lot of ministry going on here – while we search for a pastor, we still serve God. This is our chance to show that we are a dedicated and vibrant church!

Unicameral Session Minutes
For August 26th, 2012

On Sunday, August 26, 2012, at 11:45AM we met in the Chapel for devotions led by Elder Dale Vandebark. At the conclusion of the devotions and prayer, we moved to the High School classroom for the business portion of the meeting. Our Moderator Rev. Bob Millspaugh called us to order and service. A quorum was declared with 12 Elders present.

The business meeting began with a visit from Rev. Debbie Rundlett, General Presbyter. Rev. Rundlett conducted a question and answer session regarding the pastor search and whether we need to find an interim or continue with pulpit supply, and how best to support our PNC.

Clerk's Report: The agenda for August 26, 2012 was approved along with the minutes from the July 15, 2012 meeting. Various publications received have been placed in the library.

A. Correspondence:

- a. A thank you note was received from Beatrice Fisk for the flowers we sent. The Fisks would like to become members of Trinity. They will join by Letter of Transfer from Overbrook Presbyterian Church in Columbus, Ohio
- b. A letter from Muskingum Valley Presbytery regarding Debbie Rundlett's desire to trade in her Sabbatical to do post graduate work at Case Western University. The Presbytery is asking that we:
 - i. Participate in either an Appreciative Inquiry Summit, a cohort, or testing materials she develops
 - ii. Contribute to the \$18,500 that needs to be raised for her tuition.

B. Facility use requests:

- a. Amanda Allison requests use of the Fellowship Hall on behalf of the Scrapbooking Group. The group requests use of the hall on the first Tuesday of each month from 5 – 9PM. 20 persons are expected to attend. Request approved.
- b. The Toastmasters request use of the picnic shelter on September 13, 2012 from 6 -8:30PM. Request approved.

Moderators Report: No report.

Deacon Report: Minutes received.

Presbytery: The next meeting will convene September 29th and 30th in Canton. Elder Crooks will serve as commissioner. Changes are coming for the COM.

Old Business: The Foster / Thorburn deed was transferred as approved in the last session meeting.

New recording equipment has been installed, but is not yet functional. Funding for the equipment will be resolved by Elder Sidwell, Finance Committee chair.

Worship and Music Report: Committee will meet in Sept on the 12th. 69 received communion during the worship service on August 5, 2012. Trained elders have served 2 homebound members so far.

Outreach: No report.

Christian Education: The committee presented an amended child safety policy. Our background checks are secured and there is limited access. The new policy was approved. The Clerk of Session will look into locating the church policy manual and getting copies for elders.

Personnel: No Report.

Nominating & Membership: No Report

Finance: The monthly finance report was presented. The balance figure for **Error! Reference source not found.** was positive. The committee did not meet in August. They will meet in September to work on the stewardship campaign. Report accepted.

Building and Grounds: The committee recommends posting exterior signs to direct people to the Fellowship Hall. Approved. The committee also reports that the Chapel has no air conditioning and the Parlor air conditioning is not working.

Missions: Reported with no action items. We participated in ServeFest. 6 members in total worked in Jim Tucker park, cleaning, painting. The committee is always looking for ways to get congregation involved in short, local mission projects.

Youth Committee: No Report

New Business: Elder Foster requested information on getting his daughter baptized. A motion was made to baptize Alyssa Foster on Sunday Sept. 2. Approved.

Time of Sharing Joys and Concerns: Thanks to God for all the blessings at Trinity. Joy - as of August - Marshal's sons are 5 yrs and 3 yrs sober.

The meeting was adjourned and closed with prayer at 1:10 pm by Rev. Millspaugh, Moderator. Next scheduled Session meeting is September 16, 2012.

CODE COMPLIANCE

New buildings as well as existing buildings must comply with the Ohio Building Code and the Ohio Fire Code regulations. This is true in public buildings, especially for the egress/ingress from rooms, auditoriums, corridors and exit doors, to name a few. The Ohio Building Code, Means of Egress, Chapter 4104, General Means of Egress, Section 1003, and Means of Egress Continuity, 1003. 6 refers to "nothing is permitted at any time in aisles, corridors and etc. that are used as a means of egress.

The sanctuary is designed with an occupancy load of 300 in the pews and 30 in the choir loft. The narthex/parlor is designed for overflow occupancy of 100 with maintained aisles of egress. No aisles are permitted, by code, to be used to accommodate overflow.

At present the sanctuary has two aisles with chairs that are in violation of both the Ohio Building Code and the Ohio Fire Code.

The session, at its regular meeting on Sunday, September 16, 2012, voted unanimous to have the chairs removed from the aisles, bringing the sanctuary into compliance with both Ohio codes. This action becomes effective October 1, 2012.

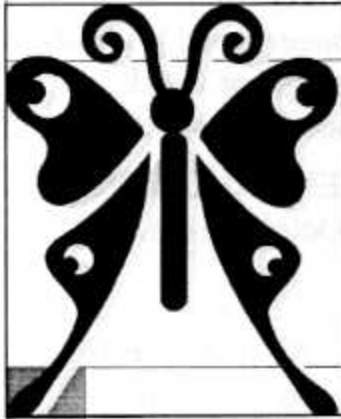
SUPPORT OUR BELLS

733 Abdella Way, The Villages, FL 32163. We are sure she would like to hear from her church family.

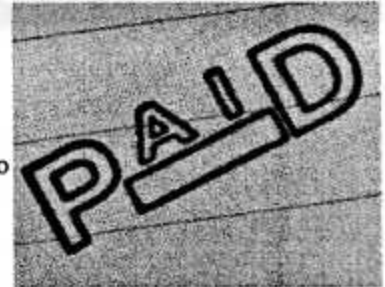
GOOD NEWS
