## **Finding Yourself in the In-between**

Although we church folks seldom consider it, we are a people on an amazing journey. Like Abram and so many other biblical ancestors who followed the Spirit's leading to a new place of promise and hope, each of us is traveling a path God has set before us. Like any journey, our path includes twists and turns, high roads and low places that we must learn to navigate.

Most people prefer to have a clear idea of where we are going and how we will get there. When planning a trip, some folks turn to maps, while others look to a GPS to guide them. But few of us have the time (or patience!) simply to head out, twisting and turning in circles, never certain where we are or how to get to our next destination. In our instant, want-it-now American culture, we usually seek the quickest and most direct path.

Congregational life is no different. When you decide to join a community, your faith journey takes another turn. You are no longer traveling alone; you have united your individual journey with the journeys of others. Your life will begin to change as you travel with others, even if you assumed your pathway would remain exactly what it was when you climbed onboard.

Most of us join churches that seem to have a clear direction, only to discover sooner or later that the roads we travel by faith rarely are smooth. Every congregation faces times in their life together when a blind turn or unexpected shift takes them down a different road. Suddenly, the church finds itself in an unfamiliar and uncertain place. You try to make sense of your surroundings, to figure out where to go from here. Going back is not an option, but it's not easy deciding where to turn next. This twist in your journey calls your congregation out of its ordinary routine. You have entered an in-between time, a space in which things may no longer feel familiar and comfortable. Naturally, this in-between time brings with it more than a bit of anxiety.

If your community of faith is in the midst of one of those in-between times right now, have no fear. Rather than living in anxiety, this can be for you a time to celebrate—because you have entered a phase that is expectant with grace. This in-between time can become a sacred space for discovering new life-giving possibilities for your congregation.

As communities of faith called by God, perhaps the most fitting biblical narrative of in-between times is the one whose primary character remains ever linked with the One Big Story. When we listen in on God's call to Abram (Genesis 12ff.), we may be surprised to discover how much is involved in responding to God's call—even before the journey begins.

First of all, Abram needed to be able to listen for God. This is no easy task for people of God today. Most of us are bombarded with noisy voices. Everybody wants something from us—our children, our parents, our friends, our bosses, our churches. Media voices speak persuasively, selling us whatever they want us to

buy or believe. If we are honest with ourselves, we might become aware that we begin to listen to another's voice only when we need help. In that moment, we hope the voice we hear is trustworthy.

Trust may not seem all that important when your congregation is coasting along, doing what feels comfy and familiar. Not until the road shifts, and the twists and turns cause us to make new choices, do we begin to wonder about which direction is right. Not until we tire of driving on the same familiar roundabout do we think of asking for directions.

When things are rocking along as usual, it's easy to forget that we are not just another group of people who happen to get together on Sundays. We are a people called by God—and God has a purpose for us. Eugene Peterson, a pastor and respected writer, once said, “The assumption of spirituality is that always God is doing something before I know it. So the task is . . . to become aware of what God is doing so that I can respond to it and participate in it.”

Think about the profound spiritual opportunity that transition offers. Biblical stories remind us that the people of God are a people on a journey often living through in-between times. When they failed to create sacred time and space, our biblical ancestors found it difficult to focus on God's leading, God's providing, and God's calling them to a specific purpose in that specific moment. Just as God calls each believer into a life of love and witness, so too does God call each congregation. That call might express itself a certain way for years; but eventually the circumstances that gave rise to a particular church will change. This community of faith may find itself wondering how to get back to the “good ol' days.” But God's invitation to congregations facing these in-between times is more challenging—yet also more faith-filled. God invites congregations to imagine how their own past might influence God's call today and into the future.

The busyness of our lives as both individuals and as communities of faith pushes us outward, rarely giving us room to stop and listen. In-between times invite churches to create sacred space where we can discover and rediscover God's call. As you begin to envision divinely inspired possibilities, your church will begin to realize the blessings of leaning into in-between times.

**For August 21<sup>st</sup>, 2011**

On Sunday, August 21, 2011, at 11:55AM we met in the Chapel for devotions led by Elder Pat Payne. At the conclusion of the devotions and prayer, we moved to the High School classroom for the business portion of the meeting. Our Moderator Rev. Floyd Starr called us to order and service. A quorum was declared with 14 Elders present:

**Clerk's Report:** The agenda for August 21, 2011 was approved along with the minutes from the 6/19/2011, 2011 meeting and the 7/17/2011 special session meeting.

The following communications were received:

- An invitation to a special Presbytery meeting on August 2<sup>nd</sup> @ 4PM in New Philadelphia, Ohio. The meeting was for the examination of candidates and to form a commission to deal with churches troubled by recent events in the PC(USA).
- Received a letter from Presbytery stating that the Associate Presbyterian's position (held by Marty Radcliff) is to be eliminated by MVP at the end of the year.
- A letter from Peebles-Herzog regarding the annual servicing and maintenance of the organ.

The following facility request was retroactively approved:

- Columbia Gas requested use of our Fellowship Hall for July 12, 2011 for a meeting of about 30 persons for a community meeting.

The following facility use requests were tabled until further information is received:

- Narcotics Anonymous (Traci Couch) requests use a classroom for a 6:30 – 8:15pm meeting of approx. 15 persons, needing 2 tables and approx. 15-20 chairs. They will provide a coffee pot. Meetings are Sunday, Monday, Wednesday and Friday year round.
- The Boy Scouts have renewed their request to meet on the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of each month from September – May from 7:00 – 8:30 in the Fellowship Hall (and class room) 20 – 30 persons expected.
- The Daisy Troop 1862 (we sponsor) is requesting the Fellowship Hall, number of persons not specified, to meet on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Thursdays of each month, Sept – June, from 6 – 7:30.

The following facility use requests were approved:

- The Zanesville Kids Stuff Sale (Tina Moore) requests use of the Fellowship Hall from Oct 9 - 15 for their annual sale.

**Moderators Report:** Rev. Starr has moved his residence. He also reported that Mildred Willis has gone on to be with the Lord. Motion was made and seconded to remove Mildred Willis from the membership rolls. Approved.

There are two weddings scheduled for September, one on the 10<sup>th</sup> and the Welch wedding on the 24<sup>th</sup>, which will be performed by a guest minister.

**Deacon Report:** No report.

**Presbytery:** As noted, the Associate Presbyterian's position (held by Marty Radcliff) is to be eliminated by MVP. Rev. Starr plans to attend the next Presbytery meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to invite the Rich Simcox Big Band Sound to perform a benefit concert at Trinity in the sanctuary on September 25, 2011 at 7p.m. The proceeds from the benefit will go toward elements that make up the labyrinth and possibly toward a piano.

The committee will meet next in September.

**Christian Education:** Motion to sponsor Girl Scout Troop 100 and Daisy Troop 1862. Approved.

Amanda requests permission to pursue a Christian Education certification. More information to be provided.

Motion made to pursue background checks on C.E. and teachers. Approved.

If you would like to help, and can not shop for items, you can mail a check to the church and the Deacons can do the shopping for you.

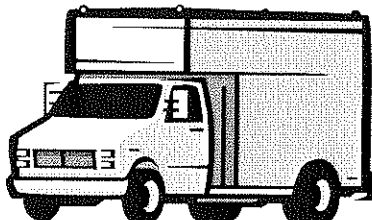

On September 18, 2011, the Worship and Music committee presented, and session approved, a proposal to purchase a grand piano for the sanctuary. This congregation has always supported and appreciated Trinity's music program. This appreciation is reflected in the high quality organ that was chosen by the newly merged congregation to be a part of the design of the new church, and in the high quality bells given later by a church family member.

Our current piano is really designed for a much smaller space. In addition, it has degraded to the point that it detracts from musical performances. Also, it is not conducive to use with the choir because of its design; the sound goes directly into the wall, making it difficult for the choir to hear from the loft. The proposed piano is designed to fill a larger space, as is commonly seen in church sanctuaries and auditoriums. The grand piano's rich sound will be an enhancement to the choirs and other musicians.

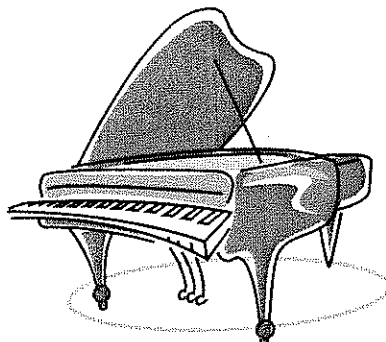
The Outreach committee is working to bring in musical guests and is in the beginning stages of hosting concerts at Trinity, such as the recent Rich Simcox Big Band concert. A quality piano will make our facility an attraction to outside musicians and music lovers alike. With this proposal we are looking at the bigger picture - the future growth of Trinity.

The proposed piano is a Yamaha GC2 in polished ebony, 5'-8" in length. CA House of Music has quoted a price of \$19,400 including the church discount. Additionally we will purchase a spider dolly which is priced between \$500 and \$600, bring the total to cost to \$20,000.

In order to pay for the piano, we are beginning a fundraising campaign entitled, "Purchase a Piece of the Piano". As with any large endeavor, it is best to break the task down into smaller components. That is what we have done here. In the narthex you will find a poster which has a list of the various components of a piano broken down by price. This is an opportunity for members to donate a component or components. Or members could go in together to purchase a larger component. For example, a piano key is \$25, the bench is \$300, or a leg is \$1,500. Donations should be clearly marked for "the Piano Fund". Donations can be put in the offering plates or given to Nancy in the office.

Our goal is to wrap up the campaign by the end of November, so that we can enjoy the rich sounds of our new grand piano as part of our Christmas Eve service.

I hope to continue to have the newsletter out in the narthex for people to pick up by the first Sunday of the month.

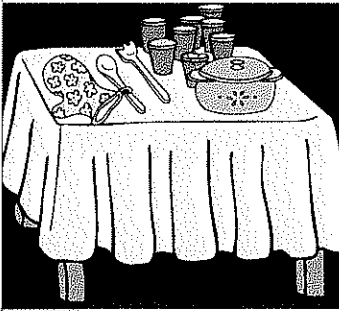

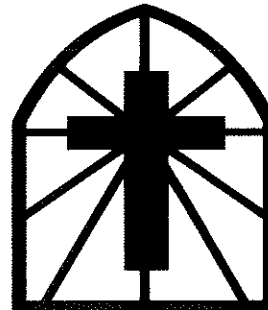

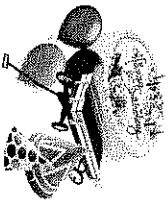
